Directives for the Establishment of the Center for the Arts

Article 1 National Taiwan University (NTU or “the University”) hereby establishes the functional NTU Center for the Arts (“the Center”) to enhance the aesthetic taste of NTU faculty and students and to organize annual art exhibitions and performances.

Article 2 The Center’s key duties are as follows:

1. Planning and organization of annual University-wide art exhibitions and performances; fostering an environment where faculty and students are encouraged to appreciate the value of the arts and humanities;
2. Discovery and cultivation of emerging artists; provision of a stage for up-and-coming artists with great potential;
3. Promotion of globalization with an emphasis on Taiwan’s cultural context; introduction of foreign artists and innovative visions;
4. Collaboration with NTU units and external organizations to extend the University’s artistic outreach; integration of art with other areas of expertise to expand the horizons of creativity.

Article 3 The Center shall establish an advisory committee (“the Committee”) to assist the Center in art event advice and review and annual plan approval. The Committee shall convene or produce a work report at least once per semester. The Committee shall be composed of 11 to 15 members selected and appointed by the NTU President from within and outside of the University. Members shall serve a three-year term but may serve consecutively if reappointed. An Executive Vice President of the University and the Vice President for Student Affairs shall serve as *ex officio* members. The Executive Vice President shall concurrently serve as the convener. The Committee shall also have a deputy convener, who shall be appointed by the NTU President at the recommendation of the convener.

Article 4 The Center shall have one director (“the Director”) to oversee its operations. The Director shall serve a three-year term but may serve consecutively if reappointed. The Director shall be an expert selected and appointed by the NTU President from within or outside of the University. To assist the Director in overseeing the Center’s operations, an executive director shall be appointed by the NTU President at the recommendation of the Director. The executive director’s term of office shall be the same as that of the Director.

Article 5 To address operational needs, the Center may appoint a number of experts from within and outside of the University as consultants. Consultant appointments shall be approved by the Committee and then referred to the University for processing in accordance with the applicable regulations.

Article 6 Depending on actual needs, the Center may engage external professional groups to help organize events.

Article 7 These directives shall be passed by the Administrative Meeting and then implemented on the date of promulgation.
